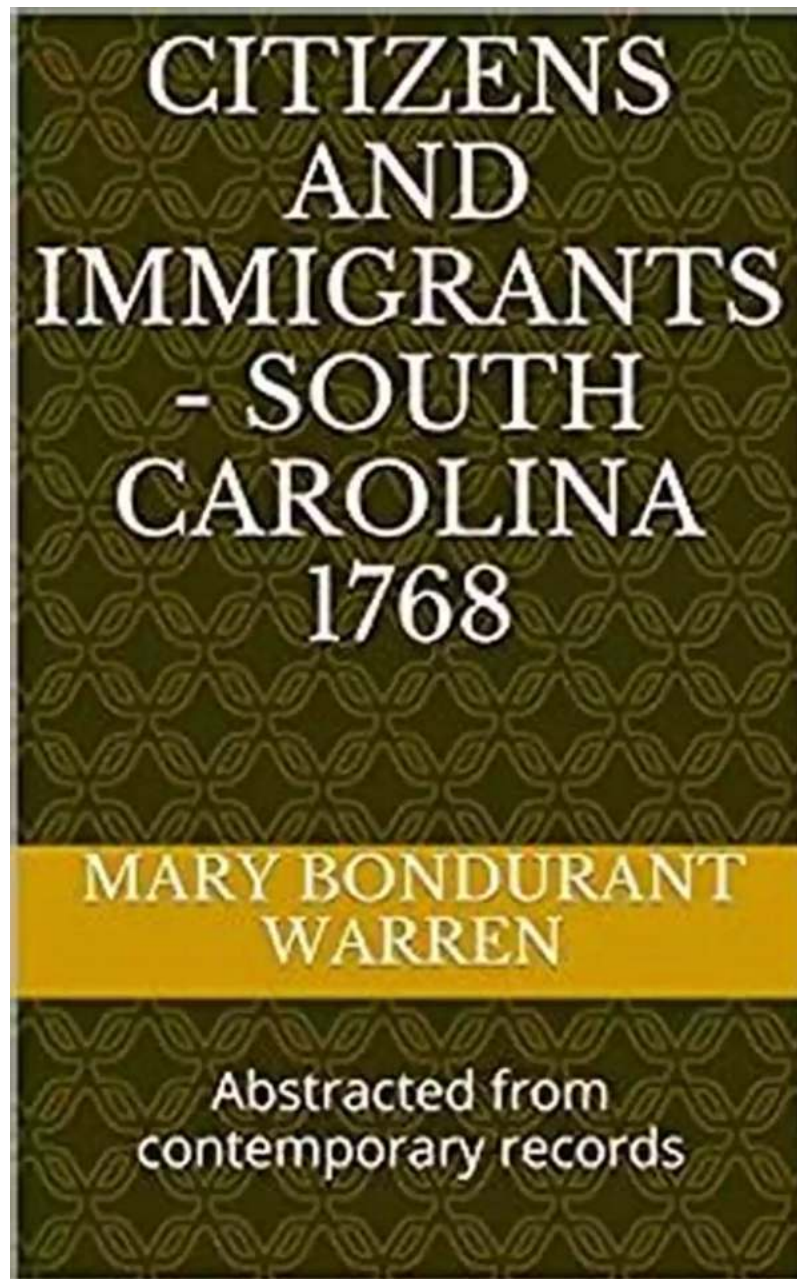


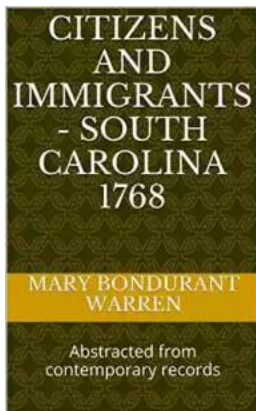

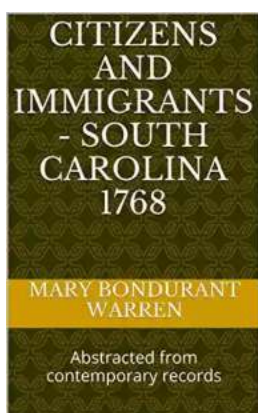

Research in colonial South Carolina is frustrated by a lack of indexes of tax, land, legislative records and newspapers. Far more than a “name list,” this book has

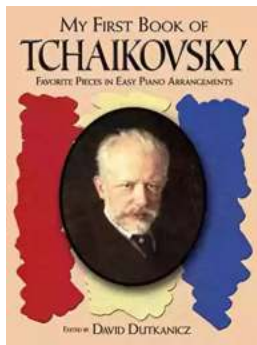
been taken from original documents and newspapers from South Carolina, and from The National Archives of England.

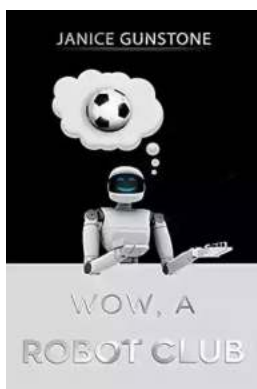
