I hope people read this and get a chuckle, or at least an insight into another place or culture. Working and travelling showed me that the more I see of the world, the

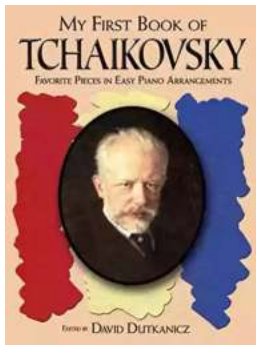
more I realize people are not all that different. We're all bonkers in our own ways!"
